These dates will be confirmed at the start of the course. Please note that the third 'year' is actually a period of about 18 months.

Course fees

For the course commencing May 2010 the fees for the first year will be £5,450 (basic fees of £5,175 plus £275 for Kingston University charges). In the first year this consists of a £50 application fee, a £400 non-refundable deposit, and the balance of £5,000. The balance can be paid in one of three ways:

- 1) A single payment of £4,880 (allowing a discount of £120) due by 31st March 2010
- 2) Half (£2,500) by 31st March 2010, plus two post-dated cheques for £1,250 each, one dated 30th November 2010 and one dated 28th February 2011
- 3) Half (£2,500) by 31st March 2010, plus a bank standing order for ten consecutive monthly payments of £250 each, commencing on 1st June 2010

Fees for the second year will normally be the same as for the first year – that is £5,450, with the same three alternative payment methods. It may, however, include an additional charge needed to cover increased cost of living or other unforeseen costs. It is our intention to keep any such increases to a minimum.

Fees for the third 'year' (actually a period of about 18 months) will be calculated pro rata on a time basis in relation to those for the first two years. Fees for the first nine months of the final 'year' will be charged and collected on a basis similar to years 1 and 2, followed by a final invoice for the last nine months of the course.

Applicants for the BSc (Hons) Acupuncture who do not have a first degree are eligible for a part-time student loan.
