Course fees

For the course commencing September 2010 the fees for the first year will be £5,525 (basic fees of £5175 plus £350 for Kingston University charges). In the first year this consists of a £50 application fee, a £400 non-refundable deposit, and the balance of £5,075. The balance can be paid in one of three ways:

1. A single payment in full (allowing a discount of £125)
2. Half payment and the balance by two post-dated cheques or credit card on line
3. Half payment plus a bank standing order for ten consecutive monthly payments

Applicants for the BSc (Hons) Acupuncture who do not have a first degree are eligible for a full-time student loan.
