Course fees

For the course commencing March 2012 the fees for Year 1 will be **£5,750** (basic fees of £5,250 plus £500 Kingston University charges). This consists of a £50 application fee, a £400 non-refundable deposit, and a balance of £5,300. The balance can be paid in one of three ways:

1. A single payment of £5,170 (allowing a discount of £130) due by 29th February 2012
2. Half (£2,650) by 29th February 2012, plus two post-dated cheques of £1,325 each, one dated 30th September 2012 and one dated 20th December 2012
3. Half (£2,650) by 29th February 2012, plus a bank standing order for nine consecutive monthly payments of £294.44, commencing on 1st April 2012

Fees for Year 2 will be the same as for Year 1 with similar options for extended payment.

In year 3 the number of College hours is much higher and the increase of your fees reflects this. Fees for the theory and clinical training in the third year are **£8,625**. Again there will be options for extended payment.

Although fees remain the same for Years 1 and 2 the College reserves the right to raise Year 3 fees by up to 10% depending on the rate of inflation.

The College may also pass on to students any increase in the annual Kingston University fee (currently £500).

Applicants who do not have a degree may be eligible for a student loan.
